Outdoor Coaching – 2 start dates

The summer group coaching will have a staggered start this year. The u11, u13s and u15s will start on Friday 8th April at 6pm. Please get there early as possible.

The u6s and u9s will start the week after on Friday 15th April.

The Under 6s (School Years YrR-Yr1) will be a 60 minute session.

The Under9s & other age group (Yr2 upwards) sessions will last for minimum of 90 minutes dependent upon the available light and weather.

Signing-on can be completed in advance or on the day itself and there are forms on the Club website (see below) if you wish to save time.

New members are welcome to try before signing up for membership but are expected to do so after attending 3 sessions.

Reminder - Parents of Children in School Years YrR to Yr4 are expected to stay for the session and games.

Youth Match Fees increase

which the club will now take on. The Club is also planning to undertake two projects this year. The first is to build an electronic scoreboard and the second is to level the cricket square in September. These projects will cost approx. £5-6K but will also benefit the Youth.

Last year we had 19 girls within our ranks (from u6s to u11s) enjoying learning to play cricket here in the town. Many of these girls have played within mixed teams (boys and girls) at u9s tournaments and a few played in u11s friendlies and league matches with a hard ball.

group down? E.g to play for the u11s as an u13 (yr7-8).

Since the Club first created the latest incarnation of the Development Plan in 2012, we recognised that one day it would be good if we could provide girls-only cricket matches. So this year a number of 'girls only' teams have been entered into u9s festivals & other fixtures will be arranged if our numbers begin to grow. Helmets - ECB Guidance for U18s

The ECB has recently updated its guidance on helmets for adults but this remains the unchanged for u18s. In essence, batsmen and wicket-keepers standing up to the stumps must wear head protection when playing or practising. (www.ecb.co.uk/youngplayershelm etguidance). The latest British Safety Standard is BS7928:2013 (for both adults and juniors).
